year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred Between James Brock
& Sally his wife of the County of Princeps Anne and John Donny of the said
County of Princeps Anne Witnesseth that the said James Brock hath
and doth for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty pound two shillings
Nine pence farthing current money of Virginia to him the said James Brock
in hand paid by the said John Donny the receipt whereof they the said James
Brock & Sally his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully contained and
paid of every part and parcel of One certain tract or parcel of Land, and doth
by these presents Grant bargain sell and confirm unto him the said John
Donny and his heirs forever One certain tract or parcel of Land situate
lying and being in the County of Princeps Anne containing twelve acres and
one quarter more or less and bounded as follows, to wit on and by the line
beginning at white Oak running to a red Oak tree on John Donny's line then
southerly to a pine then running westerly to millery tree then running northerly
to the post station binding on John Garrison line together with the appurtenances
thereunto belonging with all Houses woods ways & all other profits thereunto belonging
or in any wise appertaining to have & hold the above mentioned tract or parcel
of land and premises in fee simple and they the said James Brock & Sally his wife
for themselves their heirs Executors and administrators doth warrant and defend
the said tract or parcel of Land and premises from the just or lawful
claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever to the only proper use and behoof
of him the said John Donny and his heirs forever In Witness whereof they the said James Brock & Sally his wife hath hereunto set their hands and affixed
their Seals the day & Year above mentioned.

for the consideration of the sum of Ninety pounds current money of Virginia
to the said John Shipp & John Watters in hand paid by the said Charles Paden,
the receipt whereof we doth hereby acknowledge, & they of doth acquit the said
Charles Paden, his heirs Ex^{rs} & Administrators by these presents, they the said
John Shipp & Martha Shipp his wife & John Watters & Elisabeth his wife have granted
sold, aliene, conveyed & by these presents do grant & confirm unto the said Charles
Paden & his heirs three shares each share containing one seventh part of all
that Land and Marsh on the south end of Long Island which was formerly the
property of David McClenahan dec^d bounded by the Land of M. Robison, the marsh
of W. McClenahan dec^d, containing about an hundred Acres in the hole tract, and all
Houses & Appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging & all the right
title & Interest of them, the said John Shipp & Martha his wife, & John Watters & Eliza-
beth his wife, and the said John Shipp & Martha his wife & John Watters & Elisabeth
his wife their heirs all and singular the premises hereby bargained & sold, with the
appurtenances, unto the said Charles Paden his heirs & against us against them and
their heirs will forever warrant defend. In Witness whereof the said John
Shipp & Martha his wife & John Watters & Elisabeth his wife have hereunto set
their hands & Seals the day and year above written.
