Nine pence farthing current money of Virginia to him the said James Brock
in hand paid by the said John Bonney the receipt whereof they the said James
Brock & Sally his wife doth acknowledge themselves fully contained and
paid of every part and parcel of one certain tract or parcel of Land, and doth
by these presents grant & bargain sell and confirm unto him the said John
Bonney and his heirs forever One certain tract or parcel of Land situate
lying and being in the County of Prince Anne containing twelve acres and
one quarter more or less and bounded as follows, to wit on and by the line
beginning at white Oak running to a red Oak bind on John Bousys line then
southerly to a pine then running westerly to mulberry tree then running northward
to the first station binding on John Harrison line together with the appurtenances
thereunto belonging with all houses woods ways & all other profits thereunto belonging
or in any wise appertaining To have & to hold the above mentioned tract or parcel
of land and premises in fee simple and they the said James Brock & Sally his wife
for themselves their heirs Executors and Administrators doth warrant and further
defend the said tract or parcel of Land and premises from the just & lawfull
claim or claims of any person or persons whatsoever to the contrary purpos'd and by
them the said John Bonney and his heirs Assigns forever In witness whereof
they the said James Brock & Sally his wife hath hereunto set their hands affixed

for the consideration of the sum of Ninety pounds current money of Virginia
to the said John Shipp & John Watters in hand paid by the said Charles Padon,
the receipt whereof we doth hereby acknowledge, & thereof doth acquit the said
Charles Padon, his heirs Ex & Administrators by these presents they the said
John Shipp & Martha Shipp his wife & John Watters & Elizabeth his wife have granted
sold, alredy confirmed & by these presents do grant & Confirm unto the said Charles
Padon his heirs three shears each shear containing one seventh part of all
that Land and Marsh on the south end of Long Island which was formerly the
property of David McElrane deceased by the Lands of Mr. Robison, the man
of 11^m & 1/2 acres containing about an hundred Ares in the hole tract, and a
House & Appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging & all the right
& Interest of them, the said John Shipp & Martha his wife, & John Watters & Elizabeth
both his wife, and the said John Shipp & Martha his wife & John Watters & Elizabeth
his wife their heirs all and singular the premises hereby bargained sold, with the
appurtenances, unto the said Charles Padon his heirs & executors against them and
