This Indenture made this thirtieth day of December in the
year of our Lord Christ One thousand eight hundred Between
Edward Brown and Elizabeth of the County of Prince Anne in Virginia
of the one part and Tully Whitehurst of the same place of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Edward Brown and Elizabeth his wife for
and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds current money of Virginia
to him in hand paid by the said Tully Whitehurst before the sealing and delivery
hereof the receipt of which he hereby acknowledges and thereof doth acquit and
discharge him the said Tully Whitehurst his heirs Executors and administrators
on every of them, hath granted bargained, sold aliened released and confirmed and
by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell aliened release and confirm unto the
said Tully Whitehurst and to his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel
of Land & Marsh containing by estimation Fifty Acres more or less situated lying
being in the County of Prince Anne in Virginia in the upper part of the
Eastern shore and is known by the name of pine Island and is bounded as follows
to wit, beginning at a pine marked near Tully's line thence running down the said
line to the run, and thence to Mr. Griffin's line thence down Mr. Griffin's line to Donny's
line to Tully Whitehurst's & thence down Whitehurst line to the above Tully's line down
to the first station for Fifty Acres more or less, rents, issues and profits thereof
also the Estate rights title interest property claim and demand whatsoever of him
the said Edward Brown & wife off in or unto the said Land and premises or any part or
parcel thereof with the appurtenances, To have and to hold the said Land
and premises hereby granted bargained and sold with their and every of their appur-
tenances unto the said Tully Whitehurst his heirs and assigns to the only proper
use and behoof of the said Tully Whitehurst his heirs and assigns forever and that

Lord One thousand eight hundred & one Between Willoughby Boulton of the
State of Virginia Prince Anne County and Corporal Wickings of the afore-
said State & County, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum
of Eighty dollars current money of Virginia to the said Willoughby Boulton in
hand paid by the said Corporal Wickings at or before the sealing and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and thereof and every
part thereof do hereby acquit exonerate and discharge the said Corporal Wickings
his heirs and assigns by these presents he the said Willoughby Boulton have bargained
sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell aliened
confirmed unto the said Corporal Wickings his heirs or assigns One certain tract
