garet his wife, Caleb Boush and Mary his wife, all of the County of Princeps
Anne in the Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part, and Ann Williamson
of the said County and Commonwealth of the other part, Witnesseth
that for and in consideration of the Sum of two hundred Dollars to the
said Cornelius Calcut and Margaret his wife, Caleb Boush and Mary
his wife, in hand paid by the said Ann Williamson at or before the sealing
