This Indenture made the fourth day of May in the year of our
 Lord, Eight hundred and one Between Lewis Dey and Fanny his
 wife, of the County of Norfolk of the one part, and Anne Williamson of
 the County of Princeps Anne of the other part, Whereas Charles William
 mson late of the County of Princeps Anne, by his last will and testament
 dated on the sixth day of May in the year one thousand seven hundred
 and eighty seven, did amongst other things, bequeath unto his wife during
 his natural life, the use and profits, of one half of the tract of Land and
 plantation whereon he then lived containing two hundred Acres, together with
 the use and profits of one half of all the Houses and Orchards thereon, and whereas
 the said Fanny Williamson, widow and relict of the said Charles Williamson
 hath since his death intermarried with the said Lewis Dey. Now this
 Indenture Witneseth that the said Lewis Dey and Fanny his wife,
 for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred pounds to them in hand paid,
 by the said Anne Williamson at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents,
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, conveyed,

 of he doth hereby acknowledge he the s^d. William Batten and Fanny his wife
 have granted bargained and sold and confirmed unto the s^d. George Booth and
 his heirs One certain parcel of Land containing by estimation sixteen Acres
 and three quarters more or less lying and being in Pungo in the County of
 Princeps Anne and is bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning at a point stump
