 have granted bargained and sold and confirmed unto the s<sup>d</sup>. George Booth and  
 his heirs One certain parcel of Land containing by estimation Sixteen acres  
 and three quarters more or less lying and being in Runge in the County of  
 Princeps Anne and is bounded as followeth, to wit Beginning at a pine stump  
 joining Elizabeth Mathias's land on the eastern part of the s<sup>d</sup>. Land running  
 a northern course by a line fence unto a corner Gum joining James Whitehurst's  
 line thence turning a westerly course down a lane to the north-west corner
