all its appurtenances herein belonging or in any wise appertaining to the
only proper use and behoof him the said William Scott and his heirs and
assigns forever and I the said Richard Whitehurst doth for myself and my
heirs warrant and forever defend the said tract and parcel of Land unto the

of One 1000-500 dollars in hand paid by the said Richard Whitehurst
to the said William Scott and Betsy his wife the receipt whereof they both
humblye acknowledge and therefore doth acquit and discharge the said Rich-
ard Whitehurst and his heirs and have granted bargained aliened and
sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and deliver unto the said
Richard Whitehurst and his heirs forever a certain tract or parcel of Land
containing One hundred and seventeen acres and one quarter of an acre
and seventeen pole more or less lying nearly the Back bay and bounded
as follows. Beginning at a chinquapin running N $76^{\circ} E$ 113 chain thence
N $70^{\circ} E$ 17 chain & 17 links thence N $63^{\circ} E$ 10 to a corner tree thence
running N $10^{\circ} W$ 58 chain & 27 links to a corner gum thence running E $28^{\circ} S$
29 chain to a corner post across the road and thence to the first station, To
