This Indenture made the first day of May in the year of
 our Lord Eighteen hundred Between John Smith of the County of
 Prince Anne of the first Thomas Newton of the Borough of Norfolk surviving
 Administrator with the will annexed of John Hutchings deceased of
 the second part, and John Brown Merchant of the Borough of the third
 part, Whereas the said John Smith is justly indebted to the said Thomas
 Newton as Administrator aforesaid in the sum of Six hundred Forty seven
 pounds 18/9 current money of Virginia which he is willing and desirous to
 secure and pay to him with Interest, And Whereas the said John Smith
 and Thomas Newton have mutually chosen the said John Brown as their
 Trustee for the purposes herein after mentioned, Now this Indenture
 witnesseth that the said John Smith for and in Consideration of the
 aforesaid sum of Six hundred Forty seven pounds 18/9 which he owes to the
 said Thomas Newton as administrator aforesaid, and also for and in
 Consideration of the sum of six shillings current money to him in hand
 paid by the said John Brown at and before the sealing and delivery of
 these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted to
 gained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto
 the said John Brown his heirs and Assigns forever Two Tracts pieces or
 parcels of Land situate lying and being in the said County of Prince
 Anne with this and each of their Appurtenances, the one containing
 four hundred and thirty four Acres more or less, and the other two hun
 dred Acres more or less which James Hunter as Executor of the testated
 and testament of Patrick Parker deceased conveyed to him the said

John Smith, To have and to hold the said two tracts pieces or
 parcels of Land situate as aforesaid with their and each of their appur
 tenances unto the said John Brown his heirs and Assigns forever, Upon
 Trust Nevertheless, and these presents are upon these conditions that
 if the said John Smith his heirs Executors or Administrators shall will
 and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Thomas Newton as Adm
 inistrators aforesaid the said sum of Six hundred Forty seven pounds 18/9
 or upon the first day of May in the year Eighteen hundred and one with
 lawful Interest thereon from the date hereof until the same shall be fully
 paid, then these presents and every thing herein contained shall become
 void and of no effect, but if the said John Smith his heirs Executors or
 Administrators shall fail delay or refuse to pay to the said Thomas Newton
 as Administrator aforesaid or to his certain Attorney his Executors or
 Administrators or Assigns the aforesaid sum of Six hundred Forty
 seven pounds 18/9 with the interest which may accrue thereon at or
 upon the said first day of May in the year Eighteen hundred and one
 that then and in that case it shall and may be lawful and full pow
 er and authority is hereby given to the said John Brown his Executors
 Administrators or Assigns or Assigns at the request of the said Thomas
 Newton his Executors Administrators or Assigns to sell and dispose
 of the aforesaid two Tracts pieces or parcels of Land with their Appur
 tenances, at public Auction to the highest Bidder for ready money after
 giving Thirty Days previous Notice in some newspaper of this State
 of the time and place of Sale, and out of the Proceeds of such Sale to
 pay and discharge the aforesaid debt with the Interest thereon and
 all costs, the exception of any to be paid to the said John Smith or to
 his certain Attorney his Executors Administrators or Assigns, and the
 s^t John Brown doth covenant promise and agree to and with the said
 John Smith and Thomas Newton their Heirs Executors and Admin
 istrators and each of them, that he the said John Brown his Executors
