

Know all Men by these presents that William Keeling, of the County of Princeps Anne for, and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have for my Grandchildren Eliza Stone and William Keeling Stone Children of Johnson Stone and Sarah his wife, and for their better advancement in the World, Have given, granted and delivered, and by these presents do give, grant and deliver, unto the said Eliza Stone, and William Keeling Stone, and to their heirs forever, the following Negro Slaves, to wit, Sarah, Lety, Lilly, Easter (or Neat), Mary, James, Nelly and Hannah, To have and to hold the said Slaves with all the future issue or increase of the females of them unto the said Eliza Stone, and William Keeling Stone, and to their heirs forever. In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 28th day of May in the Year of our Lord Eight hundred and one, and of the Commonwealth the twenty fifth.

This Indenture made the sixteenth day of June in the Year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and one Between Henry Matthias, Son of Reuben Matthias dec, and Margaret his wife of the State of New York of the one part; and Isaac Matthias of the State of Virginia and County of Princeps Anne of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Henry Matthias for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred and sixty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Isaac Matthias at or before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt hereon written by the said husband acknowledge; hath granted bargained, sold and confirmed and by these presents doth Grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said Isaac Matthias his heirs and Assigns forever, all that plantation tract or parcel of Land which was devised to me by my father Reuben Matthias dec, in his last Will and Testament as will fully appear by the records of the Court of the said County of Princeps Anne being thereto had, it being the Manor plantation whereon my said father & Grandfather Henry Matthias dec, resided at the time of their death containing One hundred acres be the same more or less according to the bounds thereof as held and enjoyed by my said father & Grandfather with all Woods, ways waters watercourses & profits whatsoever to the same belonging. To have and to hold the said plantation or tract of Land to him the said Isaac Matthias his heirs and Assigns forever, to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Isaac Matthias his heirs & Assigns forever free and clear of and from all incumbrances whatsoever, and the said Henry Matthias and all and singular the promises hereby bargained and sold with the appurtenances unto the said Isaac Matthias his heirs and Assigns shall and will warrant and for ever defend by these presents against me and my
