of our Lord one thousand eight hundred one. Between Tully Benney  
and Jemimah Benney his wife of the County of Prince Anne in Virginia  
of the one part & Charles Whitehurst of the same place of the other part  
Witnesseth that for & in consideration of the sum of Three hundred &  
twenty pounds specie to the said Tully Benney & wife in hand paid by  
the said Charles Whitehurst at or before the sealing and delivery of this  
presents that the right whereof they doth hereby acknowledge they the  
said Tully Benney & wife have granted bargained & sold & confirmed  
unto the said Charles Whitehurst this heirs certain tract of Land con-  
taining by estimation Fifty acres of Land and ten Acres Marsh & the  
same more or less lying and being in Pungo Beginning at a corner  
tree on the Marsh side adjoining Major Whitehurst Land running near  
west course in the said Major Whitehurst line by a point of marsh. Then  
a corner tree in Wm Flanagan & Major Whitehurst line from thence  
turning running a southwesterly course in William Flanagan line to a corner  
tree a corner tree in William Flanagan Richard Benney & Tully Benney  
line and from thence turning running easterly course binding on the

other person or persons shall and will warrant and forever defend these
