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This Indenture made the twentieth day of August
in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and one
Between Samuel Parsons of the County Prince Anne and
Commonwealth of Virginia of the one part and Joseph Slack of
the same place of the other part; Witnesseth, that the said
Samuel Parsons for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty
Four Pounds current money of Virginia in hand paid by the said
Joseph Slack to the said Samuel Parsons, at and before the seal-
ing and delivery of these presents, the receipt hereon written he doth
humbly acknowledge, He the said Samuel Parsons, hath Granted
Bargained, sold released and Confirmed, and by these presents
doth Grant, bargain, sell, release and confirm unto the said Joseph
Slack his heirs and Assigns forever Twenty two Acres and one half,
of an Acre of Land with the Appurtenances lying and being in the
said County it being the said Samuel Parsons's part of One hundred
and thirteen Acres of Land more or less which John Hancock Junr.
sold and conveyed to William Parsons deceased by deed bearing date
the Eleventh day of December in the Year One thousand Seven
hundred and Sixty two as will more fully and at large appear
by the records of the Court of the said County, reference being made
had which said One hundred and thirteen acres of Land more or
less descended by the death of the said William Parsons who died intestate
and without Issue to the said Samuel and Hillary Parsons
his brothers, and his two Sisters one of them a wife to the said Joseph
Slack, and the other a wife to Joshua Hopkins and to Robert Parsons
being a son of their deceased Brother John Parsons Junr. To have
and to hold to him the said Joseph Slack his heirs and Assigns
