of Virginia to the said Lisha Land in hand paid by the said
Reuben Gornto at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents
the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and thereof and of every
part thereof do hereby acquit exonerate and discharge the said Reuben
Gornto his heirs and assigns by these presents the said Lisha
Land Executrix to the Estate of Jonathan Woodhouse dec^d by virtue
of his last Will and Testament, Have granted bargain sold
and aliened & confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain
sell alien and confirm unto the said Reuben Gornto his his heirs or
Assigns one certain tract or parcel of land containing thirty three
Acres more or less belonging to the dec^d Jonathan Woodhouse's estate,
situate lying & being in the said County above written, and bou-
nded by the Land of Francis Petty on Reuben Scott, and is
