in the Year of our Lord Eight hundred and one, Between, John  
Reade of the County of Princeps Anne and Commonwealth of Virginia  
of the one part, and George Vashon of the said County and Commonwealth  
of the other part, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of  
seven hundred dollars to the said John Reade in hand paid by the said  
George Vashon at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the  
receipt whereof he doth hereby confess, and thereof, and of every part thereof,  
doth hereby acquit, exonerate and discharge the said George Vashon his  
heirs, executors and administrators by these presents, He the said John  
Reade hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released, and confirmed,  
and by these presents, doth grant, bargain, sell alien release and confirm  
unto the said George Vashon all that Lot of land which was bequeathed

unto the said John Reade by his will James Tennant, situated in the  
Town of Hempville in the said County, adjoining the lands of Anthony  
Walke and William Nimmo deceased, and bounded as follows to wit  
Beginning at a stone near the corner of said Reade's store and running  
north eighty and an half degrees east, two hundred and eighteen feet and  
an half to the corner of William Nimmo's Lot, thence along his line  
south two degrees east, two hundred and twenty seven feet and three qua  
rters, thence south eighty eight degrees west two hundred twenty and  
three quarter feet, and thence north two degrees west two hundred feet to  
the beginning, with all houses, Buildings, ways, waters, watercourses,  
profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever there  
unto belonging, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remain  
ders, rents, issues and profits, and also all the Estate, right title, use, trust  
property, claim and demand whatsoever, of him the said John Reade  
of in and to the said premises, and all Deeds, evidences or writings tou  
ching, or in any wise concerning the same, To have and to hold,  
the said Land hereby conveyed, and all and singular other the premises  
hereby, bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof, with their  
and every of their appurtenances, unto the said George Vashon his heirs and  
assigns forever, to the only proper use and behoof of him the said George  
Vashon, and of his heirs and assigns forever, and the said John Reade  
doth hereby covenant and promise that said land and appurtenances, is free
