of Land commonly called and known by the name of Helland and is the  
same land which the said John Floyd purchased of Thomas Newton as  
surviving Administrator with the Will annexed of John Hutchings deceased;  
And Whereas the said Frederick Boush did on the twenty first day  
of December in the aforesaid year in order to secure to the said John Floyd  
the payment of Six hundred and four pounds being the balance of eight  
hundred and fifty four pounds which he the said Frederick Boush was to  
give to the said John Floyd make and execute a deed in trust upon this said  
Land and appurtenances. And Whereas the said Frederick Boush hath since  
satisfied and paid off the said John Floyd the said sum of Six hundred and  
four pounds with the costs and charges accruing in consequence of the aforesaid  
in part recited Deed in Trust, Now this Indenture witnesseth that  
the said John Floyd for and in consideration of the said Frederick Boush's  
having fully satisfied and paid of the said Six hundred and four pounds  
with all costs and charges accruing on the same to him; hath and doth by these  
presents for himself his heirs Executors and administrators Release, Remise  
and forever quit claim to the said Frederick Boush his heirs and Assigns  
forever all the right title Interest claim and demand which he the said John  
Floyd might or could have had by virtue of the said Deed in Trust, To have  
and to hold the said Two hundred and thirteen and a half Acres of  
Land with the appurtenances to him the said Frederick Boush his heirs  
and Assigns forever, according to the Boundaries specified in the said Deed  
as will appear by the records of the said County reference being therunto had,  
in as full and ample manner as if the said Deed in Trust had never been  
made or executed. In Witness whereof the said John Floyd hath hitherto  
set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year written and first above  
mentioned.

This Indenture made the first day of January in the Year  
of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and one, Between David  
Tentress and Peggy his wife of the County of Norfolk and Commonwealth  
of Virginia of the one part and Edward Brown of Prince Anne County  
and Commonwealth aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth, that for  
and in consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds cash paid by the said  
Edward Brown to them in hand paid also before the sealing and deli  
very of these presents the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge  
and thereof release and acquit the said Edward Brown his heirs  
Executors and Administrators have granted sold alienated transfe  
red and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alienate tran  
fer and confirm unto the said Edward Brown one certain Tract or parcel  
of Land situate lying being in the County of Prince Anne being part  
of little Scotland containing Fifty Acres more or less and bounded as  
follows to wit, beginning at Scotland Bridge running a strait line to the  
back line of Mary Dudley's line to a corner back thence south seventy  
five d. East four chain and ninety links thence along a line of marked trees  
to the main road thence along the road to Scotland Bridge being the first  
beginning and is part of the same land purchased of John Hutchings  
To have and to hold the said Fifty Acres more or less and all houses  
buildings orchards ways waters watercourses profits commodities and  
hereditaments thunlike in any wise belonging or appertaining to him  
the said Edward Brown and his heirs forever from claiming or  
demand of them the said David Tentress and Peggy his wife hereby  
covenant to warrant and defend the title of the said bargaining premises  
to him the said Edward Brown and his heirs forever; In Witness whereof  
the said David Tentress and Peggy his wife have hereunto set their hands  
the day and year first above written.
