

This Agreement between Anthony Walke & George Vashon
witnesseth that the said Anthony Walke doth grant the Farm let a
piece of ground forty yards square lying west of George Vashon's lot
in Hampshire for a lumber yard, & another piece lying south of the
same, extending in length one hundred yards more, & as broad as the
said lumber yard & the back of the said George Vashon's lot, for the
Term of fifteen years, at the rent of fifteen dollars p^a Annum; which
the said George Vashon obliges himself to pay every year at Christmas
to which agreement the parties bind themselves, their heirs, Ex^{ors}, Adm^{rs}
& Assigns, In Witness whereof they have hereunto set their Hands
& Seals the 31st day of March 1801.

This Indenture made the second day of March in the year
four, Lord One thousand eight hundred and one, Between John
Floyd of the County of Prince Anne in the Commonwealth of
Virginia of the one part, and Frederick Boush of the aforesaid
County and Commonwealth of the other part, Whereas the said
Frederick Boush on the twentieth day of December in the year of
our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Ninety nine purchased
of the said John Floyd a Tract or parcel of Land with the appurtena-
ces lying and being in the aforesaid County, containing Two hundred

and thirteen and a half Acres of Land being part of the tract or parcel
of Land commonly called and known by the name of Collard and is the
same land which the said John Floyd purchased of Thomas Newton as
surviving Administrator with the Will annexed of John Hutchings deceased.
and Whereas the said Frederick Boush did on the twenty first day
of December in the aforesaid year in order to secure to the said John Floyd
the payment of Six hundred and four pounds being the balance of Eight
hundred and fifty four pounds which he the said Frederick Boush was to
give to the said John Floyd make and execute a deed In Trust upon this said
Land and appurtenances. And Whereas the said Frederick Boush hath since
satisfied and paid off the said John Floyd the said sum of Six hundred and
four pounds with the Costs and charges accruing in consequence of the aforesaid
in part recited Deed In Trust, Now this Indenture Witnesseth that
the said John Floyd for and in consideration of the said Frederick Boush's
having fully satisfied and paid of the said Six hundred and four pounds
with all costs and charges accruing on the same to him; hath and doth by these
presents for himself his heirs Executors and administrators Release Remise
and forever quit claim to the said Frederick Boush his heirs and Assigns
forever all the right title Interest claim and demand which he the said John
Floyd might or could have had by Virtue of the said Deed In Trust, to have
and to hold the said Two hundred and thirteen and a half Acres of
Land with the appurtenances to him the said Frederick Boush his heirs
and Assigns forever, according to the Boundaries specified in the said deeds
as will appear by the records of the said County reference being thereunto had
in as full and ample manner as if the said Deed In Trust had never been
made or executed In Witness whereof the said John Floyd hath here
set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year within and first above
mentioned.
