This Indenture made the tenth day of July in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and one Between
Richard Buckhouse of Elizabeth City County and State of
Virginia of the one part, and William Cox of the Borough of
Norfolk Mere of the other part. Witnesseth that the said
Richard Buckhouse for and in consideration of the sum of
Thirty four pounds ten shillings current money of Virginia unto
him in hand well and truly paid by the said William Cox at and
before the sealing and delivery hereof the receipt whereof he doth
honestly acknowledge, and thereof and of every part thereof do forever
accrue, acquit and discharge the said William Cox his heirs
Executors and Administrators, by these presents have granted
bargained, sold, aliened, cipsoffed, released and confirmed, and
by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, alien, cipsoff, release and
confirm unto the said Wm Cox his heirs and assigns forever,
a certain Plot or piece of Land lying and being in Rustown known
by the name of Parsons's contained within the following metes and
boundaries to wit, Beginning at a Mulberry tree and running
southerly from thence forty feet to a corner stone, from thence west
wile three hundred and seventy feet, then Northly one hundred and
forty feet, then easterly four hundred feet, then southerly two
hundred and sixty five feet to the just mentioned mulberry tree,
which said Plot or piece of land is the whole Ground purchased
of George Jamison by the said Richard Buckhouse together
also with all and singular the rights, members, liberties, privileges
improvements hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever the
