This Indenture made the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August in  
the year of Christ one thousand eight hundred and one  
Between Anthony Walke, Executor of Anthony Walke  
de<sup>d</sup> of Princess Anne County, of the one part, & Ransom  
Brock of the said County, of the other part, Witneseth  
that for his Consideration of the sum of Ninety eight  
pounds to the said Anthony Walke in hand paid, by the  
said Ransom Brock, the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknow  
ledge, he the said Anthony Walke, Esq<sup>r</sup>, as aforesaid hath granted  
allied, & confirmed unto the said Ransom Brock his heirs,  
a piece of Land in Pungo, being part of a tract, mortgaged by the  
Aches to Anthony Walke, now due, & sold, pursuant to a decree  
of Princess Anne Court dated the 8<sup>th</sup> March 1798. & bid off  
by Mr. White, bounded as follows, Beginning at a post near the  
road & Ransom Brock's line, running N 87 E to the back line  
to Thomas Wright's Land, thence so to a small corner Gum, then  
beginning at the aforesaid post near the road & running  
E 45 poles to Gorutes line, thence N 87 E to the back  
line to the Land owned by Geo: Aches His Heirs, thence S  
35 E to Silas Chapples Land, thence N 29 E 35<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> poles,  
thence S 52 E 43<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> poles, thence S 74 E 18 poles, thence S 6  
E 24 poles thence to the aforesaid small Gum, containing  
about Ninety eight Acres be the same more or less, & all the
