In the Name of God Amen I Edward Bray of princeps ann County being in a weak and
 low Condition in body but perfect sound in my senses & memory blessed be God for it I do
 make & ordain this to be my last will & Testament. — I give & bequeath my soul to
 God that gaurd it & my body to the earth to be soon & truly buried according to the discretion
 of my Executors hereafter named & for my worldly Estate I give as followeth. — I give
 & bequeath to my loving wife Mary Bray the work & service of three negroes
 Tom Sampson & Nannas during her natural life & after her decease I desire that my youngest
 child should have them my intent is that that child that my wife now goes withal should
 have them & in case that child die without heir that my desire is that if about named
 negroes should be sold & the money equally divided betwix my three daughters Elizabeth
 Mary & Olive Bray. — I give & bequeath to Daughter Elizabeth Bray a negro girl
 named Nannas that her increase to her & her heirs for ever I give a negro girl Dinah
 increase betwix my two youngest Daughters Mary & Olive Bray to them & their heirs
 for ever. — I give to my loving wife the plantation whereon I now live during her
 life & after her death to be sold & the money to be divided equally amongst all my
 children. — I give & bequeath to my wife to be sold wife Mary Bray all & rest of my
 Estate & Stock that I am now possessed withall, I also nominate & appoint her my loving
 wife to be my whole & sole executrix of this my last will & Testament whereunto I
 have set my hand this first day of January 1726: (Interlined before signed)

 she & their increase betwix my daughter Hester Brock & my son Henry
 equally divided & one young maid & her increase to my son Henry Brock
 daughter Brock being at full age: & also: leave my daughter Hester Brock
 one of this wife until she come to the age of fourteen years to take care of her
 Estate in till she come to the same age & then to be delivered to her: — & also I leave my
 son Henry Brock to John mundon to bring up & take care of his Estate
 which is left to him & my plantation & land that belong to it to live on to keep in
 repair as if it was his own & to leave him the Turner Trade & if remainder part of
 my worldly Estate within & without to be sold at a publick outcry & after my death
 is paid & the Exors is satisfied the money to be divided betwix my two young children
 and also I do institute & appoint John mundon & Laron Brinson to see that this my
 last will & Testament be fulfilled
