In the Name of God Amen I Edward Lamont of Linhaven parish in
princess anne county being sick of body but in perfect sound mind & memory
knowing the uncertainty of this Transitory life do by these presents make
this my last will & Testament first I bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty
God my Creator trusting in his mercy that through the merits of Jesus
Christ my Redeemer in full hope of a Joyfull resurrection of the body that
my soul shall be at rest & my body I give to the earth to be decently buried & for
my worldly goods I give them as follows th. I prime I give & bequeath to
my son Henry Lamont my plantation whereon I now live to him and
his heirs for ever only my wife to have use of the said plantation during her
natural life with all the profits & Conventions thereunto belonging -- It
I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Lamont my great brass bedstead
of Drawers & a pin oval Table & a cow calf. -- It. I give & bequeath unto
my son Anthony Lamont a great pine cabinet & a feather bed & furniture &
large chest & three cows & calves. -- It. I give & bequeath unto my loving wife
Elonor Lamont all the rest of my estate which I have not already given after
my Just debts are duly paid I do by these presents constitute nominate & appoint
Elon my beloved wife to be whole & sole Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament with
whereof she and her heirs shall enjoy my hand & seal this 10. of April 1734
