 and Cord and if he be dead Sent him off with one Shilling Item I give and
 bequith to Providence Simmons One Cow and Cattle called white face
 and two New Shears two young Swine and four Pigs One Bant and a
 half of Corn one washing Tub one pair one Spig and one small Red dog
 Item I give and bequith to my Son John Simmons Twenty Shillings
 with what he has received all Today being his part of my Estate I give and
 bequith to my Daughter Mary Elbridge Decent her Part One Shilling
 and prudence Legt my Waring Cloes to be equally divided between them
 It I give and bequith to my Daughter Ann Witten & Elizabeth Legg
 four Barrels of Corn & Eight Sows and Eighteen Piggs and my Part
 of Wheat that is going It I give to my Grandson James Simmons one
 Doe and Lamb It I give and bequith to my Daughter Anne Miller all
 my Sheep. It I give and bequith to my Daughter Anne Miller Elizabeth
 Legt one my ten Joseph Corbel and prudence Legt to them all my Estate
 that is not Legt to be equely divided in Lotts among them four
 It I give and bequith to Providence Simmons Twenty five Acres of Wood
 some Wiling and the rest Lyning and I Doe nominate and appoint my
 Son Joseph Corbel to be my Heir and Solely Excor. I do see this my Will
 performed In Witness whereunto I have set my hand and Seal this se-
 cond Day of February One thousand seven hundred fifty three
