Be it known unto all Christian peoples by these presents that I Frances Brown Relict of the deceased Edw Brown have with my own free voluntary consent and for diverse good causes and considerations me hereunto moving but more Especially the particular love and good Will I bear unto my Daughter Elizabeth Hill and her Husband Morris Hill have given and Granted and by this present act of gift do give grant and confirm and Refeign unto the said Morris Hill and his Wife Elizabeth and to their Heirs for ever all my Estate of all kinds and Nature what so ever the said Estate with all rights profits priuileges therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining To hold the same unto the aforesaid Morris & Elizabeth Hill To the only proper use and behoof of them and their Heirs for ever and that the said Morris and Elizabeth Hill shall and may from time to time and at all times for ever hereafter have hold occupy possess and Enjoy Lawfully all the said Estate without any manner of Lawfully Detracting trouble hurt suit molestation or interruption of me or any other person or persons whatsoever Lawfully claiming the same by any act Title Consent or procam of mine In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty first day of Sep<sup>r</sup> anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1753
