 of perfect sense & memory do make this my last will & Testament that is to say first
 & principal of all I give my soul to almighty God that gave it me in hope for Christ
 sake he will receive it & my body to earth to be decently buried according to the
 discretion of my Ex^{rs} & for the worldly goods which please God to bestow upon
 me as followeth — I give to my son James Thelaball my negro boy Lewis to
 him & his heirs or assigns for ever — I give to my well beloved wife Abigail Thelaball
 three negroes viz mingo moses & moll she to have the labour of them
 during her natural life & after her death I said three negroes to be equally divided
 amongst my children — I give further give to my afore said son James
 Thelaball a plantation in princeps ann County to him my said son & the heirs of
 his body lawfully begotten for ever & if my said son James die without issue of his
 body lawfully begotten then I said land to come to my son Lewis Thelaball and the
 heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever — I give to my son Thomas Thelaball
 my plantation in Norfolk County to him my said son & the heirs of his body lawfully
 begotten for ever & if my said son Thomas die without issue lawfully begotten the
 said plantation to come to my son Lewis & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for
 ever — I give of the remainder part of my negroes to be equally divided amongst
 my children as they come to age to them & their heirs for ever. I give all my
 stock household goods to be equally divided amongst my wife & children & appoint
 my well beloved wife Abigail to be my whole executrix of this my last will & Testament
 allowing & making all other wills formerly made by me & this to be my last will
 & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fixed my seal the
 fourteenth day of march 1726

 Christ on the us and seven hundred & twenty six I Samuel Thelaball
 was of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to God
 I give all mony due to me to be paid to my son Lewis Thelaball
 principally & first of all I give & bequeath my soul into y^e hand
 of my body I commend it to y^e earth to be buried in a Christian
 manner of my Ex^{rs} in hope of a joyful resurrection of y^e sa^d
 sufferings of our Lord & saviour Jesus Christ was Touching my
 with it hath pleased God to bless me within this life I give & be
 manner — I give & bequeath all my land whereon I live to my son Lewis
 Thelaball to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten also my negro boy called
 Robert my gun & sword & pistols & heliers a dress of drawers & a coat & a pair of
 black waist nut cloth — I give & bequeath to my loving wife Doyce Thelaball my
 three negroes London Nanny & Hannah during her natural life & after her death to
 return to my children to be equally divided amongst them all — I give all my negro
 that shall be living with them in case at y^e time of my daughter Mary Thelaball
 being at age or at the Day of her marriage to be equally divided among my four
 children Robert, Margret, Horiah & Mary Thelaball also of child my wife Doyce
 with child with to have the equal share of said negroes & my will is that m^y
 negro man Cook be sold & another negro purchased with the money to goe in the
 lot amongst the rest — my will is that if in case I have no son that Lewis be
 have the heirs of the said body that my daughter Margret shall have my land before
 mentioned to my son Robert — I do hereby appoint & ordain my loving wife
 Doyce Thelaball my whole executrix of this my last will & Testament & to receive
 & disanul all former wills & Testaments Ratifying & Confirming this & no other
 but this to be my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand & seals the day by our above written
