my plantation in Norfolk County to him my said son & the heirs of his body lawfully
begotten for ever if my said son Thomas die without issue of his body lawfully begotten the
said plantation to come to my son Lewis & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for
ever — It I give of remainder part of my negroes to be equally divided amongst
my children as the come to age to them & their heirs for ever — Item I give all my
stock household goods to be equally divided amongst my wife & children & to appoint
my well beloved wife Abigail to be my whole executrix of this my last will & testa-
ment following & making all other wills formerly made by me to this to be my last will
