In the Name of God Amen I George Berry being very sick &
 weak but in perfect & sound Memory Give and bequeath unto my son
 John Berry The Mannor plantation containing with seventy Acres of Land where I now
 live on with housing and Orchards belonging to it to him and his heirs for ever I Give
 I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas Berry the plantation where his Brother George
 did live containing seventy Acres not hosting his Brother John Berry to him and his
 heirs for ever I Give to my son John one Cow & heifer yearling and all we one
 Cow & one Lamb and one Sow and pigge and one small Hen and one owl. I Give
 I Give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Berry One Cow & two Sows &
 pigges of one Buckanear Son I Give and bequeath unto my son Richard
 Berry One Bred and four mares to it and one Heifer and Cows and also one
 Cow and Cow calf and one Cow & one Lamb and also I Give to my son George
 one Cow of one Sow & pigges and one Cow & Lamb and also I Give to my son Richard
 one Hen I Give and bequeath unto James Wolfe One white faced Brinded
 Heifer a Boute four years Old and also one likely Cow & one Lamb and all the
 rest of my personal Estate I Give to my Loving Wife Sarah Berry her widowhood and
 I do make and or my two Sons Thomas & John Berry whole and sole Executors
 of this my last Will and Testament as Witnesses my hand and Seal this 27 March
 1752

Inventory

A True and perfect Inventory of the Estate of George Berry Sen died Julyth 1753. One feather bed & furniture & one bed and one cow & calf & one ewe & lamb, one hand gun, given to his son Rich^d by virtue of his will. One cow & yearling one ewe & lamb one dough & pigge & a black walnut ool table & a small hand gun to his son John by said will one cow & two dough & pigge & a hand gun to his son Thomas by will one cow & ewe & lamb & a dough & pigge to his son George by said will one four year old heifer & ewe & lamb to his son William by said will and the Remainder of his Estate left in the possession of his wife in as follows, two feather beds & furniture, four head of horses Twenty five heads of Sheep, sixly two head of hoggs seven ten head of cattle two chaise, three spinning wheels, three pair of Cards, two square tables a old set of Shoemakers tools, six pewter dishes four pewter basons, 12 pewter spoons, four pewter plates, two Looking Glasses, nine flagg bottom chaw, three drinking glasses, one Earthen tea pott one glass salt cellar, one pewter candlestick & snuffers, pewter of Tankard, one Teakel hook one grindstone, one tobacco one hand saw, two claw hammers drawing knife two, bowing Augers, three Chisels & gouge one horse cast & wheels one pair file tong, one sundial seven glass bottles four Stone Juggs one pair of Stillards, one case with twelve bottles to it, one fishing pelly Auger & a small Cannon, three drest deerhorns, two pair of money scales, three Iron wedges, five axes & a small hatchet nine hoes, three ploughs & one harrow with a suitable harness to the same, two saddles two bridles & a single bit, one hand mill one punch hole, one hundred & sixty two common small nails, & thirteen large spike nails, one spice mortar & pestle, One hundred & thirty eight small iron nails, one pair of dustail hinges, a small quantity of powder & shot three powder gords 2 powder horns & a flask, one small gill trunk & three paper cases, Eighty four musket bullets one glass flask, two T. lae breakers, two spike gimblets & one small gimblet, thirleen Old cash & a small anchor & a Old chest, a hatchet, & a loome, two flay one po grain, forty three pound of wool, five pound & a quarter of black cloth glass, two pound & a half of pickt Cotton & a small parcel of unbleach glass, one bra loom & heathen, one howel, one axes 2 bread trays one wooden bowl & a minner two water pails, one washing Tub, two pigens & anogen, one Bar of Tarr, three dipping & aum for a distil four Iron potts & Iron kettles & Iron Shille & fraying pan & plough Chain, three Rags four keap hooks alone & viol a sword & belt, two fishing lines & five hooks a Tobacco knife three sides & half of Tanned leather, two Tanned Calfskins a undred deer skin five pound of Tallow Twenty pound of Sory tobacco four printed Books a small quantity of Old Ropes, three Rakes a small Net, a bushel of wheat, a untel a reel to scane thread with, a Ligg four sharp Iron hooks, three po pott hooks, one frae a Old Sory Riddle, five pound & three quarters of toe thread, four pound & a quarter of flax unhabited three knives & six forks, Two wooden trenchers five shoe lads one Ring & Staple for Hoakes, five beehives empty, seven midline of Bacon, three windone frames, ten dung hill fowls four barrels of Corn three pound Cash
