Prince George being very sick & weak in body of sound & perfect memory praised be to God for
same & knowing the uncertainty of his life on earth & that all flesh must yield unto death
wherewithal he has vowed to call first I give & command my body to the Earth from whence it
was taken to be buried in such a convenient Christian like manner at discretion of my Executor
hereafter named & for my Soul I commit into thy hands of my Creator Trusting through thy
holy & merits of my blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full pardon for all my sins
past & to his favoring such worthy Estates of God in his mercy hath bestowed upon me part above
my deserts I give & send after abiding just debts & funeral expenses paid in manner & form
as followeth --- I doo I give & beg uath unto my Son John Hancock all my Land & prop-
erty whereroon I now lieuate him & his heirs for ever to go as far as ground that runs through
my Land that leads to Joseph White & Rudolphus Malbone and no further. It. I give &
beg uath unto my Son Robert Hancock all my other Land only other side of said road unto
and his heirs for ever. It. I give & beg uath unto my loving wife Barbara Hancock the
use of almy Land during her naturall life but that my said wife shall not molest or
interrupt either of my said Sons from building upon any part of thair Land or working of
Land whon they shall come of age. --- It. I give & beg uath unto my two Sons John & Robert
Hancock to each of them one young Cow whon they shall come of age & that I do declare &
appoint what I have here given to my two Sons by this my will to be thair full part & share
of my Estate. --- Item I give & beg uath unto my loving wife my third daughter named
Elizabeth & Barbara Hancock all rest of my Estate that is not already given by this my will
to be equally divided betwix them as my posterale Children shall come of age or day of mar-
riage which shall first happen and I do likewise make and constitute & appoint my
loving wife Barbara Hancock my whole & sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament In
witness whereof I have set unto this thirtieth day of January 1719
