merchant in London to be paid with I said money when he comes to the age of twenty one
also I give unto my son Samuel Tonont one hundred pounds in the hands of Capⁿ John
Hido when he comes to the age of twenty one years: I further my will is that the

body to earth & common mother of us all to be decently buried with Christian burial acc
ring to the direction of my hereafter named Ex^{ors} & for what worldly estate I have hath been
pleased to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as followeth: I secondly I give unto my oldest
son now living George Montgomery two dishes, thirdly I give unto my daughter Francis
Montgomery two dishes; fourthly I give unto my son John Montgomery two dishes; fifthly I
give unto my son Hugh Montgomery two dishes, all the remaining part of my estate I give
unto my loving wife Eliza Montgomery as long as she shall live & after her decease to be equal
divided among my children. I Do hereby make & appoint to be my Ex^{ors} my wife Eliza
to be my whole & sole Ex^{ors} of my last will & Testament & I witness my hand & seal this
day of Decem^r 1726
