but in case she should die before she comes to the age of twenty one years
those five negroes & all their increase to descend Equally between her two brothers
James & Samuel Tonont & to their heirs: I am first I give & bequeath unto my oldest
son James Tonont Two hundred pounds which I have in the hands of Cap: In Hild
merchant in London to be paid with interest when he comes to the age of twenty one
also I give unto my son Samuel Tonont one hundred pounds in the hands of Cap: John
Hild when he comes to the age of twenty one years: I further my will is that the
three hundred pounds which I have given to my two sons James & Samuel in the hands of
Cap: John Hild be put out to interest to the best advantage till my aforesaid children
come to age & the interest of the said money to go to my wife toward bringing up & edu

pleased to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as followeth: I do firstly I give unto my oldest
son now living George Montgomery two dishes, secondly I give unto my daughter Francis
Montgomery two dishes, fourthly I give unto my son John Montgomery two dishes, fifthly I
give unto my son Hugh Montgomery two dishes, all from arising part of my estate I give
unto my loving wife Eliza Montgomery as long as she shall live for her support to be equal
divided among my children, I do hereby make appoint to be my Exors my hand & seal this
