I Give and Bequeath unto my said Wife and Executrix Anne Campbell for her support and my childrens for her life and at her death to my heirs and assigns forever all my goods chattels and personal Estate whatsoever that I now have in possession or owing me or may have or be owing me for any space of time hereafter and which of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of July in the 5th year of the Empire of the United States of North America and in the year of our Lord God 1779
