I give and bequeath to my Son Nathaniel Hoggard all the Lands I am now possessed of, and the following Negroes (by Name) Sam, Jack, Rachel, Dave, Dilly, and Jane, my new Sword, new Gun and Pistols, Mokogany Desk, four Mokogany Tables, fourteen black Walnut Chairs and close stool Chair, two large looking Glasses (one) large Silver spoons, twelve small d<sup>r</sup> and pair Silver sugar Tongs, one silver Swivel Saddle, and Silver with Dish belong- ing to it, one large China Bowl, his choice of six young Horses that are with calf, and a Mare called Madam, my large Bible and Murray's Instruction on Ship Building, and all my Drafts and drafting Instruments all which I give to him and his Heirs for ever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Sayer the following Negroes by Name, Sam, Corry, old Nancy, Rachel and Hector to her and her Heirs for ever, likewise the Balance due to me from her Husband Charles Sayer. I give to my said Daughter Mary for ever, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hatch and the following Negroes by Name, Runney Luke, Beck Lewis America and Pleasant to her and her Heirs for ever. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Diana, Hoggard the following Negroes by name Jack, Joseph, Lucy, Tom, Judy and Rob. to her and her Heirs for ever. Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Hoggard the following Negroes by Name Ben, Kim, Isaac, Adam, James, and Nancy Jun<sup>r</sup> to her and her Heirs for ever. Item, I give and bequeath the care of my Negro Girl China to my Daughter Mary Sayer until my Grandson Arthur Sayer arrive to the Age of twenty one years, then I give the said Negro to her and all her Increase to my Grandson Arthur Sayer and his Heirs for ever. Item, It is my Will and desire that forty pounds be laid out by my Executors as soon

as possible after my Death, in the purchase of a young Negro Girl  
the use of which Negro Girl I give to my Daughter Mary Sayer  
untill my Granddaughter Susanna Sayer arrives to the Age of  
Eighteen years or Day of Marriage, then I give the said Negro Girl  
her Increase to my said Granddaughter Susanna Sayer and her Heirs

of the County of Princeps Anne and common Wealths of Virginia  
being sick and weak of body but of a sound disposing mind and  
wholly, thanks be to God for the same, do make, constitute and appoin  
t this my last Will and Testament. Inprimis, I give unto my  
daughter Elizabeth Senant the plantation whereon I now live, and  
which was devised to me by the Will of my Uncle William Hunter  
and after her Decease to my oldest Sister that shall be living  
at her Death, to my said oldest Sister I leave the said Land to her  
and her Heirs for ever. Item, I give unto my Sister Nancy Reade  
the plantation called Shirley's, together with that called Williams  
and her Heirs for ever. Item, I give unto my Nephew John  
my House and Lot at Newmarket Landing, I give the same  
unto him and his Heirs for ever. Item, I give unto my Sister Maria  
Senant the third part of my Crop and all my plate, her part of the  
same I desire may be sold and the money arising from the sale to be  
applied towards her use. Item, I give my Negro Boy named Curre  
to my Nephew John Reade and his Heirs for ever. Item, I give  
unto my Nephew John Robinson and his Heirs for ever my  
Negro Boy named Bob. Item, I give unto my Sister Sancy  
Reade and her Heirs for ever, my Negro wench named Bridget.
