In the Name of God Amen I Henry whitshurst being in perfect Mind & Memory do hereby make this my last will & Testament I do also appoint my wife Mary whitshurst to be my Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament. I then give unto my well beloved wife Mary whitshurst my best & father good & furniture Item I give unto my son Henry whitshurst half of the land where I formerly dwelt to him & his heirs & not to be sold to any person excepting either of his two younger brothers. I will that my son Henry have the part of the land where the house is & not to turn my two sons Robert & Samuel off till such time as they shall provide themselves with a house upon the other part of said land. It I give unto my son Samuel whitshurst the other part of said land lying in the Eastern branch to him & his heirs & not to be sold to any person or persons excepting his two older brothers. It I give unto my son Robert whitshurst Ten years provision upon my & Samuel's land I also give my son Robert one father good & furniture that he has now in his possession & one large Iron pot & one small black Trunk. Item I give unto my daughter Sarah whitshurst the best good & furniture that my son Robert has in his possession I also give my daughter Sarah one small Iron pot and one large black Trunk. It is my Desire that all the rest of my Estate that I have at my house where I now live & at my house in the Eastern branch be Inventoryed & sold to pay m^r. George morosley's Children & what is left to be Equally Divided between my wife and children October 9th 1726
