In the Name of God Amen I James Tooley of princeps ann County & Colony of virginia  
being weak in body but of sound perfect mind & memory thanks be to God therofore  
knowing & considering of this life & the certainty of death do therofore make this  
my last will & Testament revoking & annulling all former wills by me hereto  
fore made & do. Or dain this to be my last will & Testament in manner & form following  
first I resign my soule to God that gave it and my body to the earth from whence it  
was taken hoping for a joyful resurrection at the last day therof: then I do hereby bequeath  
satisfaction of I owe Christ my most blessed Saviour & Redeemer as Touching that  
worldly Estate which hath pleased God to bestow upon me with I give & bequeath in  
manner & for following (viz) ... In primis I give & bequeath to my son Adam  
Tooley my plantation whereon I live & my negro man called Grausson provided he  
shall pay to my son in law William Miller three thousand pounds of good port wine  
the first most being thousand & next most following I also give to my son Adam my  
young mare called pleasant (Stom) I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Tooley one negro  
girl called Sonny with her increase I also give her one of a feather bed & furniture belonging  
to it which bed I have & I give also six large powder plates & two powder dishes also  
one stock of boots (Stom) I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Morris one negro man  
called pinus provided that her husband shall pay to my son in law John Whitehead three thousand  
pounds of good port the first two made next ensuing as my son Adam is to pay my son Miller  
I also give to my daughter Elizabeth Morris my bed mare called Sonny & the fole which she is  
now with fole with to my grandson James Morris I also give to my daughter Elizabeth Morris  
one brass Kettle (Stom) I give & bequeath to my daughter Margot Whitehead one Iron pot  
holds between three or four gallons with hooks also to my son Whitehead I give my gun I also  
give to my granddaughter Abia Whitehead one deep powder dish & four powder plates I also give  
to my daughter Margot one stock of boots (Stom) I give to my daughter Rebecca Miller three  
thousand pounds of good port which my son Adam is to pay her I also give to my granddaughter  
Cathy Miller my young horse I also give to my daughter Rebecca one of a feather bed & bolster being  
the best I have with one rug & pair of shoes & one brass Candlestick (Stom) I also give to my  
daughter Margot three thousand pounds of port to be paid her by my son in law William Miller  
as above mentioned I also give to my grandson Adam Whitehead one two year old horse (Stom)  
I give to my son Adam one feather bed with furniture with all my hogs & one mill & two pecks  
of corn I also give to my son Adam one horse called Chownut (Stom) my will is that all my Cattle which  
I have equally divided between my son & all my daughters together with all I shall receive of  
any estate except the powder barrels to my daughter Elizabeth and Christ to phel  
rich I give to my daughter Mary and I appoint my son Adam Tooley my  
executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have set my  
hand & day of February 1728. and  
James Tooley
