On the Name of God Amen I James Haynes of Prince of Ann County being very sick & weak of body but of sound & perfecte memory & Caling to mind the uncertainty of this mortall life do make & ordain this my last will in manner & form following upon my death will & Testaments by me heretofore made. I give & bequeath myselfe in the hands of Jesus Christ my Saviour & Redemer where I trust he hath full power & remission for all my past sins & offences of my body I give to the Earth from whence it came to be buried in such decent manner as my Exors hereafter named shall think fit & convenient & for all such worldly goods as it hath pleased God out of his great goodness to bestow upon me I give in manner & form following: Item I give & bequeath to my son John Haynes my silver Tankard my feather bed now lyng upon all the furniture belonging thereto: one Dark Cullered mare about two years old & one two year old maled of his own mark & all hogg mark of his own mark one framed stile & all my working cloathes & Cloath that I have torn up within this hours for ever. Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Frances Haynes one large book Skin bound with locks & keys one large looking glass & frame & all the Catts of her mark for given her by Capt. Henry Moore & all her mothers wearring cloathes & two gold rings & one silver spoon one gold bracelet & one pair silver show Claps & a Silver vished box & one silver tooth pick to her hairs for ever: Item my will is all my land that I had of my first man shall be sold by my executors after named as they shall think fit and at my debts to be paid out of it & what is left of said land to be equally divided between my two aforesaid two children John & Frances Haynes to them their heirs for ever: Item I give & bequeath unto my sons The James & Francis Haynes my daughter Margaret Crum & one Shilling the Legimony to each of them to be paid out of my Estates by my Exors whom I shall hereafter name to them and their heirs forever: Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Frances Haynes my next best feather bed with bedding of furniture belonging to it & my dressing mare called flat to her heirs for ever: Item my will is that all the rest of my Estates both personal & real that I shall or may in England or Elsewhere fall to me by any will or Testaments of my relations shall be sold of my Estates which I have not already given to be equally divided between my aforesaid two children John & Frances Haynes to them & their heirs forever but if either of these my aforesaid two children John & Francis Haynes should die before they marry or come to the age of twenty one then my will is that the inheritance should be enjoyed by the whole that is given to them by my said will & further my will is that my son John Haynes & his wife shall be the sole & undivided proprietors of his part of my Estate immediately after my said will is pronounced & have immediate possession of his part of my Estate before his son: my daughter Frances Haynes to be possessed with her son or immediately after his day of marriage or at the age of twenty one years and further my will is that those my children John & Francis Haynes should live & abide with their brother Henry, to whom we desire during their minority: to whom shall be ordinat & appoint with my son John Haynes to be one of the my last wills & testaments & other works thereof done & made & signed my seal this 3 day of Aug 1722

such worldly goods as it hath pleased God out of his great goodness to bestow upon me I give in manner & form following: — Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Haynes my silver Tankard on feather bed I now lie upon & all the furniture belonging to my bed & chamber & Dark Cullered mare about two years old & one two lamb marked of his own mark & hogg's mark of his own mark one framed slate wall my wairing cloathes & cloath that I haue to make up to him & his heirs for ever. — Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Frances Haynes one large Sister Skin trunk with locks & keys on large looking glass & frame & all the Cattlo of her mark first given her by Capt. Henry Moore & all her mothers wairing cloathes & two gold rings & one silver spoon one gold bracelet & one pair silver show Clasps & little vases & box & one silver tooth pick together her heirs for ever. Item my will is all my land that I haue of Law & fit man shall be sole by my executors after named as they shall think fit and all my debts to be paid out of it & what is left of y<sup>e</sup> said sale of my lands to be equally divided between my two children John & Frances Haynes to them their heirs for ever. — Item I give & bequeath unto my sons the James & Frances Haynes my daughter Margaret Brunt one Shilling Star, a sum money to each of them to be paid out of my Estate by my executors whom I shall hereafter name to them and their heirs for ever: — Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Frances Haynes my next best feather bed with bedding & furniture belonging to it & my bed & chamber & feather bed together heirs for ever. — Item my will is that all the rest of my Estate both personally & real that I shall or may in England or Elsewhere fall to me by any wills or testaments of my relations & all the rest of my Estate which I haue not already given to be equally divided between my forementioned two children John & Frances Haynes to them their heirs for ever but if either of these my forementioned two children John & Frances Haynes should die before they marry or come to the age of twenty one then my will is that he or she in whose enjoyment the wholothal is given to him by my said will further my will is that my son in Haynes spouse the wholothal is given to him by my said will further my will is that my son in Haynes immediately after my said will is proved shall haue immediate possession of his part of my Estate before giving to my daughter Frances Haynes to keep off with her son or immediately after the day of marriage or at the age of twenty one years and further my will is that the young children John & Frances Haynes should live abide with their brother John in good howe dairing their minority. — Item of & do ordain to appoint with my son John Haynes to be one of the my last will & Testament In witness whereupon I have set my hand & fixed my seal this 13 day of Aug 1732.
