 Ewes and Lambs and two of the best beds and furniture I have in Blackwater
 and all the rest of the household Goods I have there. Item I give and Devise
 to my well beloved Daughter Eleanor Phillips One black Mare named
 Piggery and Two Cows and Calves two Ewes & Lambs and the Land &
 Plantation as I bought of Israel Slaughter proviso my said Daughter
 should make to my brother Rob' Roe a good and shareable tenement
 of land that formerly belonged to Richard Moy which land I gave to or
 changed to the said Slaughter for the said plantation but if in case my said
 Daughter shall refuse to make my said Brother Rob' Roe a good share
 title to the said Land above mentioned my Will and Desire is that
