of the County of Prince Anne & Colony of Virginia
being Sick and Weak and knowing the uncertainty of
this Life do Ordain this to be my last Will & Testament
in manner as follows my Soul unto him who
who gave it me in hopes of joyful Remission
through Christ my blessed Redeemer. I Give and
Bequeath unto my Friend John Gardner all the
South end of my Plantation formerly called
containing by estimation thirty Six Acres ad-
joining to Edward Samuels to him and his heirs
forever. I Give & Bequeath unto my Friend George
Chapel all that piece of Land more or less lying
between the North corner of my Land above
marked by line marked Trees to him and his
heirs for ever. I Give and Bequeath unto my Son
John Forty five Acres of Land upon the North
corner of the Land above live upon to him and
his heirs for ever. I Give & Bequeath unto my Son
Nathan the Plantation I now live upon to him
in forty five Acres after my Wife decease to him
and his heirs for ever. I Give and Bequeath unto
my two Sons James & Jonathan Mason the main
part of my Land to be Equal divided to them and
their heirs for ever. I Give and Bequeath to my four
Sons John, James, Jonathan & Nathan Mason
my Black to them & their heirs for ever. I Give &
Bequeath to my beloved Wife all the Remainder of
my Estate that is not already given during
her Widow hood nominally & appointing
my beloved Wife as said & be it that this my last
Will & Testament duly & truly accomplished
in Witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed
my Seal this 2^d Day of February 1760.

Virginia In the Name of God Amen this
Twenty Third day of August One Thousand Seven
Hundred and Eighty One Edward Capps of the
County of Prince Anne and State of Virginia
being very poorly but perfect Mind & Memory do com-
mit my Soul and Body into the hands of God that
gave them likewise Ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament as followeth, I Give and Bequeath
unto my Son William Capps the South end of the
main Plantation on which I now live to be large
Red Oak standing in the Plantation and point the
said Oak running and East and West to be large
the said Land to him and his heirs for ever.
I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Edward Capps
from the said Oak the Southward part of the plantation
on and said Land and March adjoining to him
and his heirs for ever only I reserve to use of the
hole Land and Plantation to my Wife during
her Widowhood. I Give and Bequeath unto my
dearly beloved Wife Betty Capps one Feather bed
and Furniture and young horse one cow & calf one
ewe & Lamb one hand Mill one Dutch Dish &c.
One large Chest one middle six post & large
fourteen Ditch one sow & Pig to her and her heirs
for ever. I Give and Bequeath all the rest of my
Estate within and without doors to be Equally
divided between my Wife and children to them and
their heirs for ever. I also appoint my Wife Betty
Capps and my Son William Capps they whole
