 selay Daughter of Hillary Mosley one Negro Child
 called Rose to her and her Heirs for ever. Item I give
 and bequeath to Charles Harvey my Saddle and Bridle
 to him and his Heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath
 to Lydia Harvey wife of Charles Harvey one hundred
 pounds if there is so much after my just debts are paid
 and funeral Expenses, and if there is not so much my
 will and desire is that Adam Mosley and Elizabeth Mos-
 ley shall make that sum up to her and my Will is if their
 should be any thing more than that sum that all shall go to
 Lydia Harvey and to her Heirs for ever And Lastly
 I do appoint my friend Hillary Mosley Executor of this
