 to god therefore calling into mind the mortality of my body, & knowing it is appointed for
 all men once to die: do make & ordaine this to be my last will & Testament. That is to say
 principally I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of god that gaurd it & my
 body I recommend to the earth to be buried in such Decent Christian Buriall: I desire
 of my Executors not doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same againe
 by the mighty power of God & as Touching such worldly Estate it hath pleased god to bestow
 in this life I give & dispose of the same in the following manner & form: I give &
 bequeath to my Son Charles the plantation whereon I live with all the Land adjoining
 provided my Son Charles shall be Convey & make a good sure firm Title to my Son
 Rodolphus of all that plantation & land whereon I live & as I lately sold to him
 his heirs: but if my Son Charles do not make over if a bound said plantation to my Son
 Rodolphus then I give & bequeath this whereon I now live to my Son Rodolphus: his heirs but
 if either of my Sons Charles or Rodolphus should die in their minority or without Issue
 then my will & desire is that my Son Francis shall have & enjoy one of the aforesaid plan-
 tations which if survivor of my aforesaid sons shall think fit: provided always
 reserving to my loving wife apart during her life (that is to say) my parlour & parlour

negroes one named Sonoy & one named Do: & do begeth her disposing but my will and
desire that my son Francis achis shall have if said negro for immediately after my wife
decease. Item I give to my granddaughter Hatherine daughter of William achis one Negro
girl named Sugg. Item I give to my granddaughter Margot Edwards one negro named
Peggy after my wife's decease. My will is that my grandson John Edwards shall have the
first child that shall be born of her if said Peggy, but if said child must sucken you
and half to him if said John Edwards be his hoir for ever. Item I give to my son Sam
achis one now bed on sugs & two blankets & one pair of sheets one cow & six pils. Item
I give to my granddaughter Hatherine daughter of William achis one yearling hoir for
I give to my grandson John Edwards one yearling hoir. I give to my granddaughter Sarah
daughter of John achis one cow & her increase. I give to my granddaughter Jane daughter of
John achis one hoir of two years old. I give to my granddaughter Elizabeth daughter of
Francis achis one ewe lamb & one hoir. Item I give to each of my grandchildren beind
what is given one lamb to each my said grand children being above in number an
for all of rest of my list to be not already given. I give to my well beloved wife Hatherine
during her natural life after her decease my will is that my said estate be equally
divided between my sons William, John, Francis, & Adam achis: and be appoynted
constituted & ordained my leusing wife Hatherine achis my son Francis achis my wife
(and sole ex: & executor of this my last will & Testament) to each & annuling a chur-
wills by me at any time hereafter made will & do begeth satisfying & confirming
thereunto other to be my last will & Testament. In further Testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seals the day by year first about written
