ghter Dinah Mason one hundred acres of Land more or less which is the
Land William Battin formerly Live on running with a State Creek as the
Dicks runs to the back Line thro the Swamp lying to the N. E. of said Land
and lying upon Tully Williamsons Land to her & her heirs for ever I
gave and bequath to my Daughter Mason one halfer half to her &
him for ever I Give and bequath unto my Son George Battin my Plan-
tation I now live on my Carpenters tools and one Great pot after her
Wife dies deced to him and his heirs for ever and my Will is that in Case
my Son George Battin should die without heir lawfully begotten of his
Body then my Will is that my two Daughters Mary Battin and Sarah
Battin should have the said Land Equally Divided between them only I
gave the whole proper Use of the said plantation to my Loving Wife Mary
