

Princes Anne County February the 21. 1721. In the Name of God Amen John Bonney
son being very sick & weak of body but of perfect & disposing mind & memory prais'd
be almighty God do make & ordain & appoint this my last will & Testament in manner
& form following Viz: — I give & bequeath my soul into y^e hands of almighty
God hoping to be saved through y^e merits of Jesus Christ my over blessed redeemer &
my body to the ground to be in decent buriall at the discretion of my Exor hereafter
nominated — I then that all my debts & funeral charges be contented & paid —
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Bonney all & every y^e goods and
chattel which I had by her out of the estate of my predecessor John Gaulloy dec: and one
young breeding mare with her future increase also I give her one of sather bod & fur
niture such as belongeth to it during her naturall life. also I give unto my said wife
fifty pound Cash in m^t. Thomas walke's hands & fifty pound in her possⁿ of iron Cash
also I likewise give to my said wife y^e use of our young negro wench called Hobe for
twelve months by that time. I hope she may purchase another. — It I give to my
daughter Mary Gorn to all that she has in possⁿ I likewise give to my said Daughter
one negro boy called Sam to her & her heirs for ever also one small chest. It I give &
bequeath unto my daughter Frances Bonney the above named negro wench Hobe
& her increase to her & her heirs for ever also give her one of sather bod she has in
possession & two Iron pots one ten gallons & one about three gallons. & one small
Table & four plank bottom chairs & two chests one large & one small & brass
mortar & pestle & a smoothing Iron; — I then I give & bequeath to Frances my daugh
ter one tract of plantation of land being the north end of Long Island beginning on
y^e East side of y^e said Island at an old fence made by Dennis Cross & so along y^e said
fence to the western landing being eighty acres more or less to her & the heirs of
her body begotten. — It I give all my Cattle to my three children John Bonney Mary
Gorn to & Frances Bonney to be Equally divided amongst them; — It I give my power
to be divided between my son John & daughter Frances Bonney as Equally as they can
do it & all my sheep betwⁿ son them likewise — It I give & bequeath to my son John
Bonney two plantations containing two hundred acres or thereabouts more or less being
the division where son he now lives & the remainder part of Long Island that belongs to me
one negro man & a negro woman called Hobe & Ross the land & said negroes to him & his
heirs for ever —

 of 100 pound Cash in m^t. Thomas walke's hands & five pound in her possession Cash

 possession & two Iron pots one ten gallons & one about three gallons, & one small
 Table & four plant bottom chairs & two chests one large & one small & brass
 mortar & pestle & ad iron; — Then I give & bequeath to Frances my Daugh
 ter one tract of plantation of land being the north end of Long Island beginning on
 East side of said Island at an old fence made by Dennis Crook & so along y^e said
 fence to the western landing being eighty acres more or less to her & the heirs of
 her body begotten. — It I give all my Cattle to my three children John Bonney Mary
 Go onto & Frances Bonney to be Equally divided amongst them; — It I give my power
 to be divided between my Son John & Daughter Frances Bonney as Equally as they can
 do it & all my Sheep both on them likewise. — It I give & bequeath to my Son John
 Bonney two plantations containing two hundred acres or thereabouts more or less being
 the divided wher on he now lives & the remainder part of Long Island that belongs to me
 one negro man & a negro woman called Hector & Ross the said negroes to him & his
 heirs for ever; — & lastly as for y^e rest of my Estate both personall & real I give to
 my Son John Bonney appointing him Sole Executor of this my last will & Testament
 revoking & disanuling all other wills & Testaments by me formerly made In witness
 wherof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the Day and year above written —
