In the Name of almighty God Amen The last will & Testament of John Cornick
 I give & bequeath my soul to god that gaurd it & my body to the earth to be decently buried
 in a full certain hope of a joyful resurrection at the last Day through the grace & mercy
 of Jesus Christ my only Lord & Saviour & my worldly goods & Estate I give & bequeath
 as followeth: - I give & bequeath unto my son Lemuel Cornick all my Land to him
 and his heir Ever & provided if said Lemuel die without issue all y^e whole Estate of Land
 shall be Divided Equally amongst all my Daughters: also I give & bequeath unto Diko
 one negro girl called Betty & also one negro boy called Jasper to him only my Lov: wife
 shall have y^e Labour of the above said two negroes during her life: - I give & bequeath
 unto Lemuel Cornick my still one Chest of Drawers & an oval Table to him
 for Ever but if said Lemuel should die before the coming of age shall be
 Equally Divided as before mentioned: - I give & bequeath unto my daughter fr:
 woodhouse one young negro child called by the name of Anya to her & her heirs for
 ever also I give unto Diko one young bay mare: - I give & bequeath unto my
