In the Name of God Amen, that I John Dyer of the parish of St Andrew of the County of Down
do hereby give & bequeath to my son William Dyer forty acres of land which he now holds, it being de-
vised by a little run from that whereon I now live to him & his heirs for ever & also one cow and
yearling of two years & a half head of sheep & of the furniture that belongs to it, from then
and my oldest son & daughter from further sick & labour for his full part of all my Estate
for ever, I do hereby bequeath to my son John Dyer fifty acres of land whereon I now live & also
thirty acres of swamp land that I bought of James Moore to him & his heirs for ever & also
one female horse with her increase, I give all the rest of my Estate of all kind of nature what-
soever to my wife but void wife Sarah Dyer during her widowhood to bring up my child
born with & then upon the day of marriage or otherwise if she should not marry at the
day of her death my desire is that all that is then remaining of my Estate may be equally
divided between my four children, namely John & James, Sarah & William Dyer
or increase either of their five children should die before such time, that then the remain-
ing ones may equally divide it, & lastly I constitute & appoint my afore said loving wife
Sarah Dyer my sole & whole leg. of this my last will & Testament & bequeathing & a making all
other wills & Testaments by me formerly made, In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & seal this 6 day of Janry 1729/30

In the Name of God Amen &c. I John Turner of the parish of St Andrew being sick &
do hereby give & bequeath to my son William Turner my my plantation whereon I now live to him &
the heirs of his body, but for want of such heirs to the Turner & the heirs of his body, also
I give to the said William Turner one feather bed beneath whereon I now live with two sheets & one
blanket, also two cows & yearlings, & one cow & calf, two large pewter dishes, also forty shill
in the hands of Eli. Nicholson, also one barrel of hoggs rising towards St. Pauls night
also twenty five shill with all to pay my debts, I give & bequeath to the said Turner one Negro
woman named Hannah to him & his heirs, also four cows & yearlings, also the upper bed
whereon I now lie with the furniture thereto belonging, also my riding horse known
by the name of Hazard after the ground is broken up, also two pewter dishes, also fourteen
head of hoggs, also the fifth part of all my meat, also three ewes & one lamb, also fifty two
shillings, in the hands of Adam Lord, I give & bequeath to William one Negro
man named Tony & three cows & one calf & one head of hoggs rising at Anne Norriss, two
pewter dishes & one pewter basin, also forty shill in the hands of the churchwarden, also three ewes
and one lamb, also the fifth part of my meat & one feather bed & the furniture thereto, I
give & bequeath to Lewis Price one cow & calf & one two year old heifer, also eight head
of hoggs rising at Anne Norriss, also three pounds cash he owes me & the fifth part of
my meat, I give & bequeath to Jos. Gasking junr. two swamp cows & calves & two
swamp steers two years old, also three ewes & two lambs, also twenty three shill in the
hands of Andrew Somers, also three ^{beams & two pewter} pewter dishes also fourteen head of hoggs rising the
Pasture near gone hoggs rising at St. Biddlen & eight shill in the hands of St. Morris
I give & bequeath to John Williamson son of Tully Worsen one three year old heifer and her
increase, I give & bequeath to the said Worsen son of Tully Worsen one three year old heifer of the
increase, I give & bequeath to Fred Worsen son of Tully Worsen one two year old heifer
& her increase, I give & bequeath to Tully Worsen son of Tully Worsen one two year old heifer
black, I give & bequeath to Mary Worsen daughter of Tully Worsen two year old heifer
of the same in will to be divided between the four brothers Henry Williamson, I give
& bequeath to Sarah Cartwright daughter of Mary Cartwright one cow with calf & one
yearling of almost also two ewes & one lamb, I give to Anthony Worsen four pounds
cash which he owes me, I give & bequeath abroad of James Smiths with the sa-
terest thereon to be equally divided among the above said Williamsons as
they shall come to age
