

In the Name of God Amen October 7th Day 1752
 I John Cornto being aware of Body but of perfect Sound mind and Memory
 by these give to my son Arthur Cornto all the Land thought of John Willers
 it being fifty acres by Estimation and one hundred acres joining to its end
 of the tract I now live on I also give to my son Arthur fifty acres of Land that
 I bought of Adam Hais and two or three acres joining to the above fifty part
 of it dated I know we give Arthur my son seventy acres of Land I bought of
 Capt James Dange known by the name of the broken ridges all the above and
 Land I give and bequeath to my son Arthur Cornto and his heirs for ever
 I likewise give to my son Arthur One Negro Boy called Simus to himself
 his heirs also my pistols and holsters and Carbine as far as I can likewise all
 the cattle Hogs and Sheep we call his and one Mare and sole and one
 better Bed and furniture as belongs to it one Chest. And I give to my
 sons John and Arthur all my Marbles to be Equally between them to
 y^e and their heirs for ever only reserving privilege in the said Marbles for
 my four Daughters Frances Elizabeth Amy and Lidea as long as
 they live single. It I give unto my son John Cornto the Plantations
 and Land I now live on containing three hundred and Seventeen acres
 to him and his heirs for ever and fifty acres of Swamp Land which
 I bought of Mag^r Henry Spratt to him and his heirs for ever also one
 Negro Man called Sam and one hand Sun and hand mill and my sword
 only paying Arthur for half the sword. It I give to my Daughter
 Frances all the cattle and a sheep in her Mark and one feather bed &
 furniture and one Trunk. It I give to my two Daughters Frances and
 Elizabeth One Negro Woman called Ab to them and their heirs Stern.
 I give to my Daughter Elisabeth all the cattle in her Mark and one
 feather bed and furniture and one Chest. It I give to my Daughter Amy
 all the cattle in her Mark and one feather and one feather bed and furniture
 and one Chest. It I give to my Daughter Lidea all the cattle in her Mark
 and one feather bed and furniture and one Chest. It I give to my two Dau-
 ghters Amy & Lidea One Negro Girl called Kate to them and their heirs
 Stern I give to my four Daughters Frances Elizabeth Amy & Lidea
 two Mares & one sole to be Equally divided amongst them. It I give to
 my two Daughters Frances and Elizabeth a free Liberty to Live on
 the Plantations I now live on in any house built or to be builded there on
 as long as they live single. It I give to my Daughter Margaret Thady
 one feather bed and furniture and one Cow & Lamb. and as for the rest
 of my Estate I leave to be equally divided amongst all my Children
 also I do constitute and appoint my two sons John & Arthur Cornto my
 sole and sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Revolving
 and Disannulling all other Wills and Testaments by me formerly made

1754 The within last Will of John Cornick deceased
was presented in Court by his Exors who made
Oath thereto and being proved by Mr. Raths of
John Haynes and William Woodhouse Witnesses
thereto is admitted to record

In the Name of Amen I Joel Cornick of Henrico Anne
County and Parish of Lynnhaven being very Sick &c I Give and
bequeath the Plantation whereon I now live and all the Land thereunto be-
longing unto my Son Joel Cornick and his heirs for ever and one Duck
and one sheet of Draves and one Dozen of Stathen becom Cakes but
if my Son Joel should die without Lawful heir of his Body then I
give the same Land that I have already given unto my Son William
and his heirs for ever I Give bequeath unto my Son Henry
Cornick the Land I bought of Edmund Cartwright and the Land
I bought of Cockroft Old unto him and his heirs for ever, but all the
Rail Timber and firewood that should be gotten for the Use of the Planta-
tion that I gave to my Son, should be gotten of the Land I gave to my Son
Henry during the time he should come of Age I Give and bequeath
to my three Sons Joel Henry and William Cornick Eleven Negroes
(to wit) Moll Hannah, Sarah, Miriam Dick Kate Puff Rachel
Joshua Daniel and Puff them and their Increase to be Equally divi-
ded as they should come of Age I Give and bequeath unto my
Living Wife all the money that is in the House, and my Debts that is
due to me and all my Crop of Corn to her and her heirs for ever only
that she should buy one likely Male Negro for my Son William to
be delivered to him when he should be of Age. I Give and bequeath
to my Living Wife the use of five Negroes (to wit) Bob, Mingo, Ned
Sarah and Man during her natural Life, and after her Death to be
Equally divided between my three Sons Joel Henry and William Cornick
and their heirs for ever. I Give bequeath to my Son Joel
my Large Looking Glass to him and his heirs for ever. I Give and
bequeath to my Living Wife and my Son William all my Personal Co-
tels that is not already Given in this Will to be Equally divided by the Sep-
aration to them and their heirs for ever But that my Wife should have
two years Liberty to pay the money that is my Sons part, and that the
