I do hereby make certain this my last will & Testament  
that I do say: - I give & bequeath unto the hands of

unto my Son William one mill one Trumpet one gun one sword one feather  
one furniture hereunto belonging one new powder dish one new powder

one feather bed with of furniture thereunto belonging one Chest one small powder  
one large powder bason one linen spinning wheel: - And I give bequeath
