of body but of sound minde & memory praised be God for same & calling to mind the un-  
certainty of this life & wll knowing that I must die sooner or later make and ordaine  
this to be my last will & Testament utterly revoking & making all former wills by  
me made void and this & no other to be my true & last will & Testament first I command  
my soul unto the protection of God that guard it keeping through the merits of Jesus  
my Saviour & redeemer to Receive the same in perfect bliss my body to be  
buried at the discression of my Executrix & her after named and as touching my  
worldly Estate that it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this world given and  
bestowe of yds in manner & form following (viz) — Item I give & bequeath unto  
my grandson Caleb Murray my plantation houses & land that I now live on and also  
one negro boy called Sam my pistols holsters and sword which said land &  
negro I also give to him & his heirs for ever to be delivered to him when he is Eighteen  
years old: — Item I give & bequeath unto my grandson John Murray my Enry  
land being one hundred acres of land more or less lying near on my plantation an  
Thomas Standys land also one negro boy called Sam also my Cabin & his father  
Chist also our dogger of two years old which said land & negro I also give to him &  
his heirs for ever to be delivered to him when he is eighteen years old: — Item I give  
and bequeath unto my grandson David Murray the next child that my negro son  
shall bring to him to be a year old to him & his heirs for ever to be delivered to him  
when he is eighteen years old: — Item I give & bequeath unto my grandson Rich  
Murray his next child that my negro son shall bring that comes to be a year old

To him & his heirs for ever to be delivered him whom he is eight years old. I do  
 give & bequeath unto my grandson David Murray my private gun. — I do  
 give & bequeath to my above said four grandsons two negroes Doctor & George & my  
 negrowoman boys and the rest of her incross which I have not already given after  
 their grandmothers decease to be equally divided amongst them & their heirs for ever.  
 I give & bequeath to my above said four grandsons all the rest of my estate within  
 doors and without doors to my only my loving wife Mary Murray to have it during  
 her life & after her decease to be equally divided amongst them & their heirs for ever.  
 my will & desire is that after the decease of my wife Mary Murray my son John will  
 Nicholson take all my Estate in keeping till my above said four grandsons comes of  
 age. I do ordain & appoint my loving wife Mary Murray & my son John  
 Nicholson my executors & executors of this my last will & Testament as witness  
 my hand & seal this eleventh Day of May 1731 — his mark.
