In the Name of God Amen the fifth day of February 1720/1 according to Computa-
 tion of 4 Church of England John Stirling of princess Anne County being of perfect memory
 & remembrance praised be God do make & ordain this my Last will & Testament in maner
 and form following - first I bequeath my soul into y^e hands of almighty God my Creator
 hoping that through y^e meritorious death & passion of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and
 Redeemer to receive free pardon & forgiveness of all sins & as for my body to be buried at
 y^e discretion of my Excutrix hereafter: - I give to my son John Stirling one young
 mare named Bonney & two Cows and Calves - I give to my son Rich: Stirling one plot
 of land lying at y^e South end of Chinkapon ridge in about one hundred acres - I give
 to my son George Stirling one plot of land lying at y^e South end of walstonos Island in
 quantity about sixty acres - I give all the rest of my Estate to be equally divided between
 my three youngest children both within & without. As witness my hand & seals I
 have hereunto put the date of the year first above written - I did in John Brinson
 son and my brother George Stirling to be my Excutors or
