 Planter being very Sick and Weak but of Sound and
 perfect Memory thanks be to God Do make and
 Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner
 and form following I promise I Give & Bequeath
 to Wife Anne Hancock the use of my plantation where
 on I now live during her Widowhood or the time of
 her remaining Able she too Renouncing all manner
 of right or pretention to Dower in any of my Lands
 and finding my children bed board washed and
 lodged during their Minority and teaching the
 Slaves in regard to culture in the manner I have
 done, this too to say, not to lend them two years
 running in Indian Corn & make no Rice I Give
 Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Wife Anne
 Hancock Three Cows and Calves &c &c &c &c &c
 my Soul Here called Peace and my Sister Anne
