Princip<sup>r</sup> Ann County February the 26<sup>th</sup> 1721: In the Name of God Amen & John Bonney  
son being very sick & weak of body but of perfect & disposing mind & memory praised  
be almighty God to make & appoint this my last will & Testament in manner  
& form following / viz: — I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty  
God hoping to be saved through the merits of Jesus Christ my ever blessed redeemer &  
my body to the ground to born decent burial at the discretion of my executors after  
removal — Item that all my debts & funeral charges be ortoned & paid —  
Item I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Bonney all & every good & chattle  
which I had by her out of the Estate of my predecessor John Danloy &c: and one  
young breeding mare with her foal & heres also I give her one of either bed & a  
niture such as belongeth to it during her naturall life: also I give unto my said wife  
fifteene pound Cash in m<sup>t</sup>: Thomas walke's hands & five pound in her p<sup>r</sup> of iron Cash  
also I like wise give to my said wife & uses of our young negro wench called Hobo for  
two old months by that time I hope she may purchase another: — It I give to my  
daughter Mary Gorroto all that she has in possession I like wise give to my said Daughter  
one negro boy called Sam: to her & her heirs for ever also one small Chest & I give &  
bequeath unto my daughter Frances Bonney the aboves named negro wench & her  
increase to her & her heirs for ever also give her one feather bed she has in  
possession & two Iron pots one ton gallons & one about three gallons. one small  
Table & four plant bottoms chairs & two chests one large one & one small & both  
morter & pestle & smoothing Iron: — Item I give & bequeath to Frances my daugh-  
ter one tract plantation of land being the north end of Long Island begining on  
y East Side of said Island at an old fence made by Dennis Cross & so along y said  
fence to the western Landing being eighty acres more or less to her & her heirs of  
her body begotten: — It I give all my cattle to my three children John Bonney, Mary  
Gorroto & Frances Bonney to be equally divided amongst them: — It I give my power  
to be divided between my son John & daughter Frances Bonney as equally as they can  
divide & all my sheep between them likewise — It I give & bequeath to my Son John  
Bonney two plantations containing two hundred acres or thereabouts more or less  
the one end whereon he now lieth & the remainer part of Long Island that belongeth to me  
one negro man & negro woman called Hector & also the land & said negro to him & his  
heirs for ever: — Lastly as for the rest of my estate both personal & real I give to  
my son John Bonney appointing him sole Executor of this my last will & Testament  
revoking & disannulling all other wills & Testaments by me formerly made In witness  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year above written —
