Prinsep Ann County February the 21st 1724: In the Name of God Amen I John Bonney Son being very sick & weak of body but of perfect & disposing mind & memory praised be almighty God do make & ordain & appoint this my last will & Testament in manner & form following Viz: — I give & bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty God hoping to be saved through the merits of Jesus Christ my over blessed redeemer & my body to the ground to be in decent buriall at the discretion of my Exors after nomination — I Item that all my debts & funeral charges be contented & paid — I Item I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Bonney all & every of goods and chattel which I had by her out of the estate of my predecessor John Dauloy dec: and one young breeding mare with her future increase also I give her one of either God or furniture such as belongeth to it during her naturall life: also I give unto my said wife of fifteen pound cash in mt. Thomas Walthe's hands & five pound in her possession cash — also I likewise give to my said wife if use of one young negro wench called Hobe for two or three months by that time I hope she may purchase another: — I I give to my daughter Mary Bonney all that she has in possession I likewise give to my said daughter one negro boy called Sam: to her & her heirs for ever also one small chest — I I give & bequeath unto my daughter Frances Bonney the above named negro wench & her increase to her & her heirs for ever also I give her one of either God or she has in possession & two Iron pots one ten gallons & one about three gallons & one small Table & four plank bottoms chairs & two chests one large old one & one small & brass mortar & pestle & ad smoothing Iron; — I Item I give & bequeath to Frances my daughter one tract of plantation of land being the north end of Long Island beginning on the East side of said Island at an old fence made by Donnis Crook & so along & so goes to the western landing being eighty acres more or less to her & the heirs of her body begotten. — I I give all my cattle to my three children John Bonney Mary Bonney & Frances Bonney to be equally divided amongst them; — I I give my power to be divided between my son John & daughter Frances Bonney as equally as they can do it & all my sheep betwixt them likewise — I I give & bequeath to my son John Bonney two plantations containing two hundred acres or thereabouts more or less being the divided one whereon he now lieth & the remaining part of Long Island that belongeth to me one negro man & a negro woman called Hector & Alice the said land & said negroes to him & his heirs for ever; — I Lastly as for the rest of my estate both personal & real I give to my son John Bonney appointing him sole Executor of this my last will & Testament revoking & annulling all other wills & Testaments by me formerly made In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written
