43. In the Name of God Amen. I Jonathan Bonney
son of Prince Anne County in Virginia being sick and
weak, but of perfect sound mind and Memory do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form
following, Imprimis I desire all my just debts be fully paid
by my executors, Item, I give to my loving wife Amy Bonney
a Negro Woman call'd Amy during her natural life, and the
use of my Negro man call'd Gingo during her Widowhood I
her two best Beds that I have and furniture therewith, two
Cows and Calves, also one call'd Curridge, and a black Horse
was here, call'd Chance, two Cows and Lambs, two head Hogs
two of the best Iron pots and bales that was here, six pater
Plates, two pater Dishes two pater Basins, twelve spoons, a
Chest that was here the best one, a table, a washing Tub, ju-
puggin six case bottles, two stone jugs one was here, and the other
three Gallons one, three case knives and forks, and good Glass as
two broadswords, and the hand Mill that was here, I give the
said Articles to her and her Heirs for ever, also I give to my said
wife the use of my Norward part of my Land and plantations
and Houses and Orchard being one third of my Land, alive
to be run by a man that understands laying it off, from the
Eastward bounds of my Land, straight to the top of my old bound
the westward side to her during her Widowhood, I give to
my said wife liberty on long Island, to pasture 12 Head Cattle
and 3 head Horses king during her natural life, I desire
that my Land that I own here where I now live, maybe surveyed
all rounds, by any man that understands it, and be divided into
three parts running the lines a brose East and West, Item, I give to my
son John Bonney the Southward part of it my said Land, and
my Land and Marsh on long Island, to him and his Heirs for
ever, only reserve a liberty to my two sons Jonathan and
Moses to pasture 12 head of Cattle, and three head of
Horses king, a piece on the said Island during their
natural lives, I give to my son John young boy mare
a hand gun that did belong to G. Schiffs, to him
and his Heirs for ever, Item, I give to my son Jonathan
one third part agreeable to the bounds above mentioned, the
the next to my son John part, or the Norward part after
my wife's Widowhood is ended if he chuses it and all
my Swamp Land, that lies in the Eastward Swamp
I give to him and his Heirs for ever, also, I give

him a Mare of Gray tone Culler that we ride on, a hand
Gun call'd the Buckinmore and hand Mill Cullin Stones
and my Still and Cask to him and his Heirs for ever, Item,
I give to my son Moses Bonney the other part of my Land
and plantations being the third part of it, that my son Jonathan
does not chuse agreeable to the above said bounds, I give it to
him and his Heirs for ever, also a young Horse of a Gray
Culler, a bow and Calf, and Cive and Lamb to him and his
Heirs for ever, Item, I give to my Daughter Amy Bonney
a Negro Girl call'd Peggy and feather bed and furniture
therewith a bow and Calf and Cive and Lamb, and Chest
that was her Mothers to her and her Heirs for ever,
Item, I give to my Daughter Mary a Negro Girl call'd Ann,
and feather bed and furniture and young Steer and Cive to
her and her Heirs for ever, Item, I give to my Daughter Elizabeth
a Negro Girl call'd Chirry a feather Bed and furniture
therewith a young Steer and a Cive to her and her
Heirs for ever, Item, all the rest of my estate of all kinds
and natures whatsoever, that I have not already given to
be equally divided between all my Children namely Amy
Jonathan, John, Mary, Elizabeth and Moses I give it to them
for ever, And lastly, I appoint my
wife Amy Bonney and my brother Dennis Charles my
sole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament dis-
annulling and denying all other wills formerly made by me
and ratifying this and no other to be my last Will and Testa-
ment, in witness whereof, I have here set my Hand and Seal this
17th day of June, Anno: Dom: One thousand seven Hundred
and twenty nine

In a Court Held for Prince Anne County October the 11th day 1779
The above last Will and Testament of Jonathan Bonney son of
