Smithwick and Thomas Readick Gentlemen of
the State of North Carolina greeting, Whereas
James Carraway and Anne his Wife by their
writing Indenture of Bargain and Sale bear-
ing date the Thirtieth day of October in the year
of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and
twenty seven have sold and conveyed
to James Carraway Jun^r the Fee Simple Estate
of one Acker half an Acker and Three Thousand
three hundred and sixteen Square Feet of Land
near Campes Landing in the County of Prince-
George in the said Commonwealth; And that
as the said Anne cannot conveniently travel
