two knives hereby ordering & appointing that the excess thereof to be sold & disposed off by his father & the
produce thereof arising to be appropriated to his Education as reading writing & arithmeticke likewise
to him my said grandson my large bible & serving of mother doo to my said son Francis during
his life -- I give & bequeath unto my daughter Margret mosley all my post & residue & remainder
of my Estate of what nature kind or property soever & I am to be to her & her heirs for ever hereby ap
pointing her to be my whole & sole Excut^r of this my last will in Confirmation whereof I have
hereunto set my hand & seal the 11th of august 1722
